DeVry Campus Opens in Daly City

DeVry University has opened a campus in Daly City.

The university's new site "creates a vital new opportunity for San Mateo County and South San Francisco residents to obtain higher education in business and technology fields," said Daly City Mayor Carol Klatt. "DeVry University graduates in Daly City will help meet the critical need for skilled professionals among employers in the Bay Area and across California."

University and city leaders will celebrate the grand opening at 2001 Junipero Serra Blvd. on Nov. 13.

The celebration from 10 a.m. to 7 p.m. includes a job fair and an open house for the community to see the campus and learn about its programs. The ribbon-cutting ceremony is at 5:30 p.m.

The campus opened for instruction in September and features 14 classrooms, two computer laboratories and a student center.

It will allow students to earn undergraduate degrees in such areas as business administration, computer-information systems and Web graphic design.

The university's Keller Graduate School of Management will also offer a number of master's programs in business and technology.

"With the addition of DeVry's newest California center in Daly City, we are now able to broaden our reach to students in the Greater San Francisco Bay Area," said Will Minnich, dean for the latest campus.
