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Lungomare opens in Oakland's Jack London Square

Lungomare will make its debut tonight, making for the second big restaurant opening in Jack London Square in as many weeks.

The Italian-slanted restaurant takes the place of Miss Pearl's, which closed the first week of January. It's the brainchild of Chop Bar's Chris Pastena, who is making a name for himself in the East Bay.

On the extensive menu (35+ items) are several sections, led by one dedicated to handmade pasta. Seafood is an emphasis, from crudo to a daily whole fish preparation; there's also Ligurian fish stew (\$21), squid ink pasta (\$16) and sand dab-specked risotto (\$18). Like its new neighbor The Forge, Lungomare will also serve pizza.

Lungomare will open tonight at 5:30pm. Going forward, it will be open daily from 11am to 10pm (until 11pm on Friday and Saturday nights). It will serve a midday menu from 3pm to 5:30pm. An adjacent cafe is open weekdays from 7am to 2pm and on weekends from 8am to 2pm.
