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## Day trip

### Dogpatch

San Francisco's perennially up-and-coming neighborhood arrives at last.

**True grit:** This onetime blue-collar zone sits between Potrero Hill and the bay, with Mariposa Street to the north and Cesar Chavez Street to the south. **Who let the dogs out?** The neighborhood's name is thought to come from the strays that fought over scraps from nearby slaughterhouses. **Rumble-tested:** One of the few areas undamaged after the 1906 earthquake, Dogpatch has some of the city's oldest structures, including a cluster of 1860s Victorian cottages.

**Maker nation:** The old factories lining Third Street now house photo studios, design workshops, and artisans ranging from cupcake bakers to dress-makers to luthiers. **Coming attractions:** This winter, the Museum of Craft and Design (2569 Third St.; [sfmcd.org](http://sfmcd.org)) moves into a former can manufacturing plant. Also promised is a new brewpub from the owner of Magnolia and the Alembic in the Haight. —CHRISTINE RYAN



Take I-280 to Mariposa or Cesar Chavez. Or hop on Muni's T Third Street light-rail line, which runs through Dogpatch.
