Liz Saint John interviews three guests every Sunday morning covering a variety of issues and topics. She talks with representatives from Bay Area non-profit organizations, documentary filmmakers, authors and professors. Among today's guests are:

Linda Harrison, executive director of the Museum of the African Diaspora (MoAD). Linda talks
about the history of the museum, the exhibits, the educational opportunities for school kids and
teachers, volunteer opportunities, MoAD in the Neighborhood, (this summer's traveling exhibits
and programs while the museum is temporarily closed for renovation) and the grand re-opening in
October 2014.

The Museum of the African Diaspora (MoAD) was

conceived as a cornerstone of the economic and cultural revitalization of downtown San Francisco. Since it opened in 2005, MoAD has become, along with its neighbors, the San Francisco MoMA, the Yerba Buena Center for the Arts, Zeum, and the Contemporary Jewish Museum, a dynamic cultural corridor a premier cultural destination for Bay Area residents and out-of-town visitors.

MoAD is undergoing some renovations this summer so while it's doors are closed, the museum staff is on the road with "MoAD in the Neighborhood," visiting locations in San Francisco and Oakland.
