SAN FRANCISCO (KRON) — The Bay Area is joining people around the world in honoring the memory of former South African leader Nelson Mandela.

At San Francisco City Hall, mourners are signing a condolence book to express their sorrow about the death of Mandela who was the first black to lead South Africa. The book is available for anyone to sign at Mayor Ed Lee's office in Room 200. A civic memorial is set for Wednesday morning at 8:00 in the City Hall rotunda.
