

## Steal This Look: The Ultimate Farmhouse Kitchen

The Floating Farmhouse, an 1820s farmhouse renovation in upstate New York, is a feat of engineering and the result of relentless resourcefulness from architectural designer [Tom Givone](#). In the kitchen, Givone demolished two lean-to shelters and built out the 450-square foot kitchen with a curtain wall of skyscraper glass. Inside, the kitchen is made up of new and salvage materials with punches of color.



### Faucets & Fixtures

Givone found the concrete utility sink in the basement of a neighboring farmhouse and bought it from the neighbor. The sink has the original ribbing for scrubbing clothes. If it weren't for the neighbor, Givone says he'd have looked for it at [Olde Good Things](#), a favorite resource for salvaged goods. For a new, concrete kitchen sink, the Native Trails 33-Inch [Farmhouse Double Bowl Sink](#) (shown in Ash) is made of lightweight concrete for \$1,845 at Native Trails.
