

New Wal-Mart supercenter, delayed by recession, opens in North Highlands



A new [Wal-Mart](#) Supercenter in North Highlands is open for business. The store at 4675 Watt Ave. held its grand opening on Wednesday.

The new store, which covers about 118,000 square feet at the corner of Watt and Orange Grove avenues, [replaces a Cargo Largo store](#) that had been vacant since closing in 2008. The Cargo Largo store was demolished during construction.

In 2012, the Sacramento County Board of Supervisors [gave the go-ahead](#) to a Wal-Mart Supercenter in North Highlands. The company owned the property since 2006, but put the project on hold after deciding to globally reduce its capital spending and slow the development of new supercenters.

The North Highlands store employs about 300 people. It's open from 6 a.m. until midnight.
